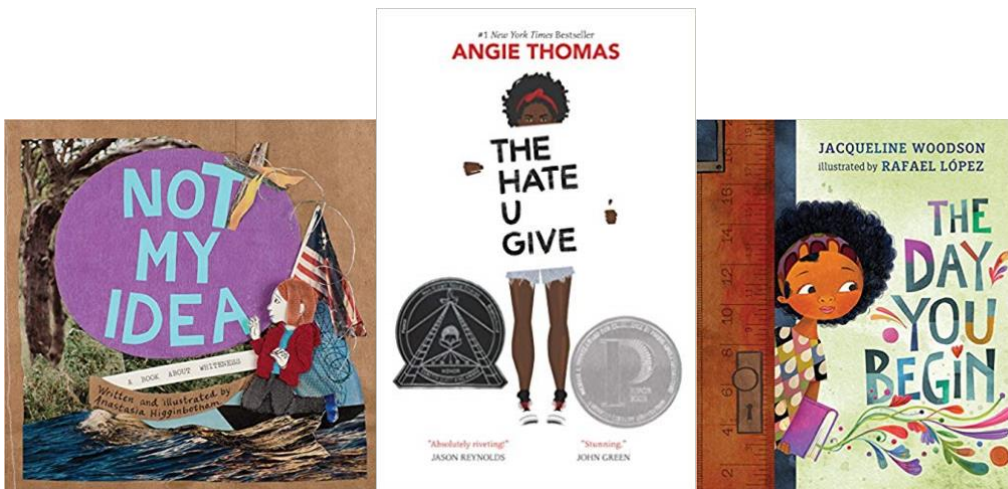

They are *Not My Idea: A Book About Whiteness* by Anastasia Higginbotham (grades 3-7) and *The Day You Begin* by Jacqueline Woodson and illustrated by Rafael Lopez (grades K-3).

COMMUNITY DINNER

Join your neighbors in a community dinner hosted by your local library and nearby restaurants! All 14 library systems in the cooperative will host a first come, first served dinner in a neighborhood park where you will eat delicious food inspired by *The Hate U Give* and get to know your neighbors.



MUSEUM EVENTS

Local museums, including the Carter Woodson Museum, Dunedin Historical Museum, Florida Holocaust Museum, Gulfport Historical Museum, Heritage Village Museum, Museum of Fine Arts, North Pinellas Historical Museum, and St. Petersburg Museum of History, will be hosting family programs focusing on African American life and art that are pay-what-you-wish to visit.



NEIGHBORHOOD WALKING TOURS

Walking tours along St. Petersburg's African American Heritage Trail will be offered on the first and third Saturday mornings of the month for families; sign up in advance. Other walking tours will include Largo's Greater Ridgecrest area and Clearwater's North Greenwood neighborhood.

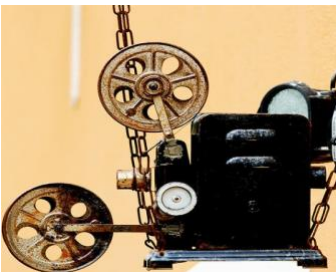
STORYTIMES

All Pinellas Public Library Cooperative libraries will be hosting family storytimes where the selected books will be read together and songs, games, and crafts will round out the program.



WORKSHOPS

Various workshops will be held at local libraries. There will be elementary, middle, and high school grades Book Clubs to discuss appropriate age-level themes and narratives. Community Flag Making Workshops will allow families to create flags representing their neighborhoods. Families will make Collage Art showcasing their neighborhood and community life. Older children will enjoy designing their own Zines and Printing Press creations through partnerships with local art studios.



MOVIES

Weekly movies on the lawn or inside libraries will be shown at all branch locations. These movies include *Hidden Figures*, *The Hate U Give*, *Pride*, *Souder*, *The Color of Friendship*, *Remember the Titans*, *And the Children Shall Lead*, and *The Princess and the Frog*.
